Learn through doing! A Claymobile Residency is a set of six ceramics classes held by a professional clay artist and their assistant. Any room at your school with tables and chairs can be turned into a ceramics classroom. The Claymobile teachers bring everything necessary to work with clay for a class of up to 30 students, including tarps for the tables and smocks for the students if requested. The Claymobile teachers will take the materials to and from the site each day, so no on-site storage is needed.

The Claymobile Program holds classes all year long. We are offering the program to 7th grade students and are able to schedule classes from 8am-8pm.

The Claymobile will work during the school day in any classroom, including but not limited to; science, social studies, and art rooms. We will work in after-school programs, summer camps, community centers, senior centers, missions and homeless shelters. Fun and interactive, this program encourages each student to act as both leader and follower during team-building exercises as students develop an ear for percussion.

The Language of Music

with Rhythm and Rhymes

Josh Robinson and Lamont Dixon lead a high energy and cross-curricular residency program aimed at teaching students of all ages and abilities about the history, fundamentals, and performance techniques of poetry and its relation to music and percussion.

Magical Music of the Theremin

with Kip Rosser

In addition to expressing their own musical ideas using this unique and special instrument, students become familiar with the scientific principles surrounding the theremin such as heterodyne principle, the human body as a capacitor for electricity, electromagnetic fields, and how we experience sound.

Journey Into Middle Eastern Music

with The Spice Route

The Spice Route Ensemble guide students through modern and ancient Middle East lands and cultures. Students learn traditional Egyptian and Greek rhythms, songs in Arabic and Hebrew and a traditional line dance—the Debke—from Lebanon.

Voyage of Discovery with Lewis and Clark

Students go on their own "Voyage of Discovery" as they explore together the vision that lay behind this famous three-year journey that changed American history forever. Students have the opportunity to play the jaw harp, penny whistle and fiddle that accompanied the expedition.

Voices with Alexandra Day

Students unearth their potential in this vocal residency while learning vocal warm-ups and technique, microphone technique and the historical context for the vocal pieces they study.
